Disaster Recovery Center to Close in Sebring

ORLANDO, Fla. – A Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) is scheduled to close at 7:00 p.m. Saturday, December 9, in Sebring.

Disaster Recovery Centers offer in-person support to individuals and small business owners. Survivors still needing help may visit any DRC. They may locate one near them by calling the FEMA Helpline at **800-621-3362 (Voice, 711 or VS) or 800-462-7585 (TTY)**. Helpline numbers are open from **7 a.m. to 11 p.m., seven days a week**.
